Your insurance plan will cover the cost of one standard breast pump at 100% when ordered from an in-network supplier. Below are listed the contact number and web address for three national breast pump suppliers. You are not limited to order from these suppliers, and you can locate other equipment suppliers from your account on www.anthem.com. In order to receive a breast pump, simply contact the supplier to speak to a representative and they'll be able to assist you in choosing and ordering your breast pump. You must order the pump 30 to 60 days prior to your due date. Your physician/doctor will need to write a prescription for the pump because the vendor will require it. Please see the list of breast pump vendors below. You can also order a breast pump from a retailer such as target. As long as it is not a hospital grade pump you can submit a claim for reimbursement. You will pay for the pump in advance and once the claim is processed Anthem will refund you at 100%.

- If you order the pump through a place like Target, you will not need a prescription. You will
 only need a prescription if you order through a Durable medical equipment provider such as
 Medline
- As long as the breast pump is not considered a hospital grade breast pump (which will say in the description) you are covered at 100%.
- If it is a hospital grade pump it will go towards your deductible and out of pocket.
- For reimbursement, you do not need to wait 30-60 days before due date. You can still submit the claim for reimbursement without prescription from doctor. As long as it's one breast pump a calendar year you are okay.
